Welcome Ethel Lund

Ethel Marie Lund was born on November 4, 1931, in Wrangell, AK to Carl Lund and Martha Blanch Ukas. Her father was a fisherman and her mother a home-

maker. Ethel's father died in a fishing accident when she was three. Her mother married Virgil Harto about six years later. Ethel is the only child of Carl and Martha and had a half-brother from her mother's marriage to Virgil. Ethel's mother died when she was 14 years old and she spent the rest of her teenage years with her maternal grandparents. Ethel graduated from Wrangell High School and then began Nursing school in Portland, OR. However, after two years of Nursing school she was unable to complete the program due to illness. Ethel married Leo Comer in 1953 and they had four children: David Comer (deceased); Diane Comer (Portland, OR); James Comer (Bremerton, WA) and Leah Beck (deceased). Leo passed away in 1977. Ethel remarried after that to Sonny Gonzales, who she says really loved her children. Sonny has since passed away. During her younger years Ethel worked with hospital laundry; at a movie theatre and in a fish cannery. As an adult she worked for Blue Cross, as a nursing assistant, and as a Medical Secretary. In 1963 Ethel moved back to Wrangell. In the 1970's Ethel was very involved with the ANB/ANS and was part of a Health Committee that worked on bringing the Mt. Edgecumbe Hospital from a Public Health Service hospital to becoming the current, native managed Southeast Alaska Regional Health Consortium. This undertaking took Ethel ten years and trips to many different villages to convince them to join the move to make Mt. Edgecumbe Hospital into SEARHC. It took every single village's to agreement to make it happen. Ethel says that watching the USPHS flag come down and the SEARHC flag go up was one of the greatest days of her life, other than when her children were born.














National Activity Professionals' Week— January 21st-27th, 2018


Mister wanted to come to work, so Peter obliged. It seems like Mister did his job, bringing out many smiles through the building!








We were 'on the air' for KCAW this month.
